

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

April 8, 2024

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a regular meeting on April 8, 2024, at 5:01 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. There were present Mayor Kathy O’Nan, City Attorney representative Tori Seng, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator Jeremy Creason, Public Works Superintendent Aaron Blount, City Projects Administrator Justin Carrico and City Clerk Karen Wilson.

Police Chief Nathan Kent opened the city council meeting.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan led the council in prayer.

Councilmember John Poole led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan read a statement proclaiming May Child Prevention Month and Sexual Assault Prevention Month in the City of Mayfield.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan read a statement proclaiming May as Building Safety Month.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan announced that the city received a \$5.9 million dollar grant for stormwater retention efforts for Red Duck Creek. She also stated that the request to the Kentucky Legislature for funds for reconstruction of city buildings was passed and awaiting the governor’s signature.

On a motion by Poole, seconded by Adams, with Binkley, Poole, Adams, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Cox, and Carr, voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the March 11, March 14, and March 18, 2024, minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

On a motion by Cox, seconded by Rodgers, with Binkley, Poole, Adams, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Cox, and Carr voting yea, and with none voting nay, council passed on first reading **Ordinance 10-24** an ordinance “amending design guidelines and standards for damage recovery overlay precinct (drop) B-3 mixed use zone in Ordinance 2-23 and making amend design guidelines and standards for damage recovery overlay precinct (drop) zone applicable to the B-3 Central Business District zone.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Rodgers, with all those present voting aye, and with none voting nay, council passed **Resolution 4-1-24** a resolution “authorizing the surplus of property from the City of Mayfield Police Department. Motion passed unanimously.

Department heads gave their reports.

With no further business to come before the Council, on a motion by Carr, seconded by Adams, the meeting was adjourned at 5:52 p.m.
