The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a regular meeting on April 11, 2022 at 5:00 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. Mayor O’Nan introduced Graves County Jail employee Corporal Christopher Roberts, who presented Cody Rogers with a Commonwealth Ambassadors award. Officer Rogers was honored for his off-duty actions in assisting the jail employees following the December 2021 tornado.

Al Chandler and Ryan Drane with Long Term Recovery gave updates to the council as well as those in attendance.

Mayor O’Nan read proclamations declaring April as Child Abuse Prevention and Sexual Assault Prevention Month. Lori Brown with Lotus and Denise Brazzell with the Commonwealth Attorneys Office were on hand to accept the proclamations and to speak about the programs they represent.
