

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

August 12, 2024

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a regular meeting on August 12, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. There were present Mayor Kathy O’Nan, City Attorney Jay Matheny, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator Jeremy Creason, Public Works Superintendent Aaron Blount, City Projects Administrator Justin Carrico and City Clerk Karen Wilson.

Police Chief Nathan Kent opened the city council meeting.

Councilmember Johnny Jackson led the council in prayer.

Councilmember Barry McDonald led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

On a motion by Poole, seconded by Rodgers, with Binkley, Poole, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Parrott, and Carr, voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the July 8, 2024, minutes. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Jackson, with Binkley, Poole, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Parrott, and Carr voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 13-24** an ordinance “amending the code of Ordinances, City of Mayfield, Kentucky, Chapter 6, “Fire Prevention and Protection,” Sections 6-3 “Rates” regarding ambulance service fees.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Rodgers, with Carr, Parrott, Jackson, McDonald, Whitnell, Rodgers, Poole and Binkley voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 14-24** an ordinance “amending zoning ordinances for the City of Mayfield, Kentucky with respect to the cultivation, dispensing, processing, production, sale, and advertising of medical cannabis within the City of Mayfield, Kentucky.” Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

On a motion by Poole, seconded by Jackson, with all those present voting aye, and with none voting nay, council passed **Municipal Order 3-24** “a municipal order establishing the position of “Police Sergeant of School Resource Officers” for the Police Department of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky and incorporating the position of “Police Sergeant of School Resource Officers” into the City of Mayfield, Kentucky Handbook.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by McDonald, seconded by Jackson, with all those present voting aye, and with none voting nay, council passed **Resolution 8-1-24** a resolution “authorizing the expenditure of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding by the City of Mayfield, Kentucky.” Funds will be used to repair the Child Safety House for the Mayfield Fire Department. Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Whitnell, with all those present voting aye, and with none voting nay, council passed **Resolution 8-2-24** a resolution “ of the City of Mayfield authorizing the filing of a Kentucky House Bill (HB) 752 Project Grant application for up to \$48,231,000.00 in HB 752 funds with the Department of Local Government (DLG); authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of Mayfield to execute any documents which are deemed necessary by DLG to carry

out this project; and authorizing the mayor to act as the authorized correspondent for this project. Motion passed unanimously.

By Executive Order 8-24 the mayor announced the appointment of Jenn Reeder to the Mayfield-Graves County Parks and Recreation Board.

Department heads gave their reports.

With no further business to come before the Council, on a motion by McDonald, seconded by Rodgers, the meeting was adjourned at 5:32 p.m.
