

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

December 20, 2021

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a special called meeting on Monday, December 20, 2021, at 5:45 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. This meeting had been scheduled for December 13, 2021 but had to be rescheduled due to a EF4 tornado that struck Mayfield and Graves County on December 10, 2021. There were present Mayor Kathy O’Nan, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator, Jeremy Creason, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Public Works Director Russ Brower, City Attorney Bo Neely, and City Clerk Tamie Johnson.

Police Chief, Nathan Kent, opened the city council meeting.

On a motion by Rodgers, seconded by Adams and with Carr, Adams, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, McDonald, Todd, Herndon, and Johnny Lee Jackson voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the minutes of the November 8, 2021, meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Herndon, and with Johnny Lee Jackson, Herndon, Todd, McDonald, Whitnell, Jackson, Rodgers, Adams, and Carr, voting yea and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 7-12** “an ordinance of the City of Mayfield, amending appendix A, article IV, section 4.0402 of the code of ordinances of the City of Mayfield to provide for conditional residential uses for districts zoned highway commercial district B-1.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Adams, seconded by Carr, and with Carr, Adams, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, McDonald, Todd, Herndon, and Johnny Lee Jackson, voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved on second reading **Ordinance 8-12**, “an ordinance of the City of Mayfield amending appendix A, article IV, section 4.0502 of the code of ordinances of the City of Mayfield to provide for conditional residential uses for districts zoned neighborhood commercial district B-2.” Motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 9-12 was not presented for second reading at this meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

On a motion by Rodgers, seconded by Herndon, and with Johnny Lee Jackson, Herndon, Todd, McDonald, Whitnell, Jackson, Rodgers, Adams, and Carr voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved on first reading **Ordinance 10-12**, “an ordinance of the City of Mayfield to rezone 317 S 9th Street, Mayfield, Kentucky from R-2 multi-family residential to B-1 highway commercial. Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by McDonald, seconded by Whitnell, with Johnny Lee Jackson, Herndon, Todd, McDonald, Whitnell, Jackson, Rodgers, Adams and Carr voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved **Resolution 12-1-21** “a resolution to amend the 2021-2022 budget to allow for structural damage at fire station 3 in the amount of \$10,980.00. Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Jackson, and with Carr, Adams, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, McDonald, Parrot, Todd, Herndon, and Johnny Lee Jackson, voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved **Resolution 12-2-21** “a resolution amending the 2021-2022 budget to allow for the purchase of an HVAC unit for the police department in the amount of

\$7,166.00." Motion passed unanimously.

Councilmember Parrott arrived at 7:00 pm.

Monthly reports were given by department heads and councilmembers.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
