

# CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

February 12, 2018

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met on Monday, February 12, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, Mayfield, Kentucky. There were present Mayor Teresa Cantrell, Fire Chief & Ambulance Director Jeremy Creason, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Public Works Director Russ Brower, Director of Planning and Community Development John Poole, City Attorney Dennis Null, and City Clerk Tamie Johnson.

Councilmember Barry McDonald led the council in prayer.

Councilmember Johnny Jackson led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Cantrell recognized Little Caesars of Mayfield as the business of the month. Anthony and Taga Jones were presented with a certificate and a sign to place at the business location.

Mayor read a proclamation declaring this week as Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) week in Mayfield.

Tracey Adams, with Graves County 4-H, along with several students from the future city team, presented to the council their future city which will be used in a competition later in the month.

On a motion by Cox, and seconded by Potts, and with Cox, Summers, Potts, O’Nan, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, and Elder voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the minutes, from the January 8, 2018 meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

## NEW BUSINESS

A motion was made by Cox, seconded by Adams, to approve **Ordinance 1-18** “an ordinance, amending the code of ordinances, City of Mayfield Kentucky, chapter 9, “occupational license, taxes and regulations,” to add article VI, “Mobile Food Vehicles”.

Then a motion was made by Elder, seconded by Jackson, with Summers, O’Nan, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Myers, Adams and Elder voting yea and with Cox and Potts voting nay, Council amended **Ordinance 1-18** changing item E to read seven (7) Days in a public area and 14 days in a private area also, changing item J, by removing the word business when talking about generators. Motion passed 8 to 2.

So then on the motion made by Cox and seconded by Adams, with Elder, Adams, Myers, Jackson, McDonald, Whitnell, O’Nan, Potts, Summers and Cox, voting yea and none voting nay, Council approved on first reading **Ordinance 1-18**. Motion passed unanimously.

Reports from Department Heads and Committees were given.

On a motion made by McDonald, seconded by Myers with Elder, Adams, Myers, Jackson, McDonald, Whitnell, O’Nan, Potts, Summers, and Cox voting yea and none voting nay, council entered into executive session to discuss possible litigation per KRS 61.810(1)(b). Motion passed unanimously. Because of the nature of the executive session, Mr. Whitnell chose not to attend.

On a motion by McDonald, seconded by Potts with Cox, Summers, Potts, O’Nan, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Myers, Adams, and Elder voting yea and none voting nay, council returned to regular session. Motion passed unanimously. No action was taken during the executive session.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
