

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

February 10, 2014

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in regular session on Monday, February 10, 2014 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, Mayfield, Kentucky. There were present Mayor Teresa Cantrell, Asst. Fire Chief/Safety Officer Jeremy Creason, Police Chief Bryan Morrison, City Planner Brad Rodgers, Public Works Director Russ Brower, City Attorney Boyd Neely, and City Clerk Tamie Johnson.

Council member Al Page led the council in prayer.

Council member Johnny Jackson led the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Cantrell recognized Hair Port Beauty Salon and Derksen Portable Buildings as this month's business leaders.

On a motion by O'Nan, and seconded by Adams and with Stinson, Myers, McDonald, O'Nan, Whitnell, Jackson, Page, Adams and Goodman voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the minutes from the January 13, 2014 meeting. Motion passed unanimously. Mr. Potts left the room during the vote.

OLD BUSINESS

On a motion made by Potts, and seconded by Goodman, with Stinson, Myers, Potts, McDonald, O'Nan, Whitnell, Jackson, Page, Adams and Goodman, voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 1-14** "an ordinance amending Section 10-4, "Yard Sale Regulations." Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion made by Goodman, and seconded by Adams, with Goodman, Adams, Page, Jackson, Whitnell, O'Nan, McDonald, Potts, Myers and Stinson, voting yea and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 2-14** "an ordinance establishing a penalty for removal of code enforcement signs." Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

On a motion made by O'Nan, seconded by McDonald, with Stinson, Myers, Potts, McDonald, O'Nan, Whitnell, Jackson, Page, Adams, Goodman, voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved on first reading **Ordinance 3-14** "an ordinance amending ordinance 10-92, regulating the transporting of patients, fees charges, medical necessity requirements and certification requirements from attending physicians, for services rendered by the Mayfield-Graves County Ambulance Service." Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion made by Myers, seconded by Adams, with Stinson, Myers, Potts, McDonald, O'Nan, Whitnell, Jackson, Page, Adams and Goodman, voting yea and with none voting nay, council approved **Resolution 2-1-14** "a resolution declaring property as surplus." Motion passed unanimously.

On an motion made by Myers, seconded by McDonald, with Goodman, Adams, Page, Jackson, Whitnell, O'Nan, McDonald, Potts, Myers and Stinson, voting yea and with none voting nay, council approved **Resolution 2-2-14**, "a resolution approving the advancement of up to \$6,000.00 to the Mayfield Tourism Commission, to be paid back from room tax receipts collected and handled directly by the City of Mayfield. Motion passed unanimously.

Councilmember Johnny Jackson asked that the Finance and Administration Committee look into the possibility of lowering the municipal insurance tax by two points.

Reports from Department Heads and Committees were given. Council members also gave their respective board reports.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:00 p.m.
