

**CITY COUNCIL MINUTES  
CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY**

May 13, 2013

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in regular session on Monday, May 13, 2013 at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall, Mayfield, Kentucky. There were present Mayor Teresa Cantrell, Council members Jonathan Stinson, Wayne Potts, Barry McDonald, Kathy O’Nan, Johnny Jackson, Jana Adams and Tyler Goodman; Fire Chief Mike Jones, Police Chief Bryan Morrison, City Planner Brad Rodgers, Public Works Director Russ Brower, City Attorney Boyd Neely, and City Clerk Tamie Johnson.

Council member, Charles Whitman, led the council in prayer.

Council member Tyler Goodman, led the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Cantrell recognized Subway of Mayfield and Shelby Automotive this month’s business and industry leaders. Haviz Panahoandi of Subway of Mayfield and Steve Koenig, with Shelby Automotive were presented with certificates of appreciation.

Mayor Cantrell read proclamations for the Mayfield Housing Authority recognizing April as Fair Housing Month, for Graves County Child Advocacy Program recognizing April as Child Abuse prevention and awareness month, and proclaiming April 12<sup>th</sup> as Arbor Day in Mayfield.

Dr. H. Steve Freeman, Vice President of Institutional Development at WKCTC addressed the council concerning the growth of the job training facility on US 45.

Representative Richard Heath updated the council on new laws recently passed during the 2013 General Assembly.

Mr. Robert P. Meyer, 428 W Water St, Mayfield Ky 42066, addressed the council concerning the disrepair of sidewalks in the city limits.

On a motion by McDonald, and seconded by Potts and with Stinson. Potts, McDonald, O’Nan, Jackson, Adams and Goodman voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the minutes from the March 11, 2013 meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

**OLD BUSINESS**

On a motion by Potts and seconded by O’Nan, and with Stinson, Potts, McDonald, O’Nan, Adams and Goodman voting yea and with Jackson voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 2-13** “an ordinance amending chapter 5, cemeteries, by adding columbarium opening and closing costs”. Motion passed six to one.

On a motion by McDonald, and seconded by Stinson and with Goodman, Adams, Jackson, O’Nan McDonald, Potts, and Stinson voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 3-13** “an ordinance amending chapter 13, planning & development, by updating schedule of fees”. Motion passed unanimously.

**NEW BUSINESS**

On a motion by Adams, and seconded by Goodman, and with Stinson, Potts, McDonald, O’Nan, Adams and Goodman voting yea and with Jackson voting nay, council approved on first reading **Ordinance 4-13** “an ordinance addressing abandoned vehicles, junkyards and the abatement process for certain nuisances”. Motion passed six to one.

Reports from Department Heads and Committees were given. Council members also gave their respective board reports.

Mayor Cantrell reported she had attended the Graves County Fiscal Court meeting earlier in the evening. Mayor Cantrell advised the council that the fiscal court does not wish to sign the previous submitted inter-local agreements with the City on their joint ventures with the City. This includes the Mayfield Graves County Ambulance Service, Kess Creek Park and the Mayfield Graves County Parks and Recreation Board. The City has already passed legislation to sign the agreements.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 7:27 p.m.
